**SIDE-BY-SIDE MASS OBLIGATIONS** This year, because Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve fall on Sunday, Catholics are obligated to attend Mass two days in a row in each of two weeks - or maybe two masses on one day. As Father Paul Kavanagh, Director of Divine Worship, explains it, we have an obligation to attend Mass on the following Sundays and Holy Days:

- Sunday, December 24: Fourth Sunday of Advent
- Monday, December 25: Nativity of the Lord
- Sunday, December 31: Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph
- Monday, January 01: The Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God.

However, on December 24, we could attend a Sunday Mass in the morning, and a Vigil Mass for the Nativity of the Lord at 4.30 PM or 6.30 PM. 9:000 PM or MIDNIGHT MASS. And on December 31, we could attend a Sunday Mass in the morning, and a Vigil Mass for the Solemnity Mother of God at 05.00 PM. But for those who are wondering, no, we cannot fulfill both obligations on December 24 or 31 with just one Mass.

#### **MERRY CHRISTMAS**

"Heavenly Father, Thank you for sending Your Son Jesus to earth. We not only celebrate His birth in the manger, but also the reason for His coming -- His death on the cross. #### What does the Solemnity of Mary mean?

The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God is a liturgical celebration observed on January 1st. It is a holy day of obligation for Catholics, meaning that Mass attendance is required. (The use of the word "Solemnity" here is not a statement about Mary's personality. It is a designation used for certain days within the liturgical (churchbased) calendar of the Church. Solemnities are the highest rank of liturgical celebration, higher than feast days or memorials. By celebrating a solemnity dedicated to Mary's motherhood, the Church highlights the significance of her part in the life of Jesus and emphasizes that he is both human and divine. Though New Year's Day may seem more like a day for football and hangovers than for Mary, there's a beautiful spiritual significance in celebrating her during the heart of the Christmas season. Pope Paul VI, in his apostolic exhortation Marialis Cultus (1974), called the Solemnity of Mary "a fitting occasion for renewing adoration of the newborn Prince of Peace, for listening once more to the glad tidings of the angels (cf.Lk 2:14), and for imploring from God, through the Queen of Peace, the supreme gift of peace."

#### Stewardship Corner Fourth Sunday of Advent Weekend of December 23/24

In today's Gospel reading we hear proclaimed the story of the Annunciation, when the angel of the Lord announced to Mary that she would give birth to Christ through the intercession of the Holy Spirit. Mary allowed God's messenger to speak to her. She was attentive, not afraid to enter into a dialogue, then unconditionally obedient. Mary's acceptance of this mystery is a stewardship model for us. Good stewards remain open to the incursions of divine life into the normal course of their daily lives. How open are we to the promptings of the Holy Spirit in our own lives? What might we do this last week of Advent to be more attentive to the Lord?
