This year, through the 2024 Share Lent Campaign, “Reaping Our Rights”, Development and Peace-Caritas Canada reminds us that everywhere on Earth, and especially in the Global South, impoverished peoples are facing growing challenges. Rural populations in particular are negatively impacted. As a people of Christian faith, animated by the social teaching of the Church, we defend rural communities’ rights to life, land, water, biodiversity, justice, health, participation in decent livelihoods, and a healthy environment.

I encourage you wholeheartedly to join the “Reaping Our Rights” campaign through its Lenten and fall phases by:

- donating generously to the Share Lent collection, especially on Solidarity Sunday, which is always on the 5th Sunday of Lent. Solidarity Sunday falls on March 17th, this year.
- participating in the education and action campaign that will take place in the fall of 2024. This element of the campaign will encourage our country Canada to do more for small-scale farmers and peasants around the world.


