Yard Maintenance Announcement

April 2024

Greetings, everyone! Spring has arrived, and with that comes yard work and lawn care, both at home and at church. Every year there is a group of people that tend to the cemetery and the area around the church, the parish office, and the rectory. The lawn needs to be cut with ride on mowers, push mowers and line trimmers. If the grass is long when it is cut, raking is required to keep the lawn beautiful. Sometimes grass has to be swept or blown off of headstones and the artificial flowers near the headstones need to be tidied. There is always garbage to be collected and flowers to be tended.

We do all of this work for the sake of our beloved dead and for the beauty of our church property.

You can see, however, that there are many tasks, and the work is time-consuming when only a small number of people are committed. And so we are asking for your help. We all have our own properties to look after, but if several parishioners are willing to give a bit of time, we can maintain our church property as well. It could be just an hour a week or a couple of hours every two or three weeks. The more people involved, the less time required. Last year, close to twenty people volunteered to help with yard maintenance. It's a big job but, when the work is shared by many, it is manageable and rewarding.

There is a sign-up sheet at the back of the church on the table to the right as you are leaving. If you think you could give of your time in this way, please put your name, phone number and email address on the list, and indicate what you would like to do. Perhaps you will commit to cutting lawn, sweeping grass off of headstones or simply picking up garbage around our property.

We will contact you and organize a schedule, beginning in mid-May and ending in mid-September. For those of you that need training with the power equipment, someone will help you learn how to use the mowers and trimmers safely.
